# Approval of May 3, 2022 Minutes

Property tax millage rate to be levied to support the proposed General Fund budget Schuhmacher moved to comply with the General Appropriations Act (MCL 141.437) by adopting the tax levy for Fiscal Year 2022/2023 of .6491 mills per \$1,000.00 (one thousand dollars even) of taxable value for the Operating Millage for the General Fund. This levy will generate \$474,801.00 (four hundred seventy-four thousand, eight hundred one dollars even) which is \$22,075.00 (twenty-two thousand, seventy-five dollars even) more than the amount levied for the 2021-2022 taxes.
